About the Dahrendorf Forum:

Since 2010, the Hertie School of Governance and the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) have jointly worked to create bi-annual symposia and public research projects in honour of Lord Dahrendorf. The Dahrendorf research project, funded by Stiftung Mercator, is designed to continuously promote outstanding research and debate on global politics and Europe through the interaction from academics and policy-makers via publications and events (please see www.dahrendorf-forum.eu for more information). The Dahrendorf Forum has previously addressed different aspects of the European project. The fourth ‘cycle’ will have two working groups; one located in London looking at the future of European governance (Chairs: Kevin Featherstone, Iain Begg of the London School of Economics and Political Science) and the other in Berlin examining Europe’s societal change and politics (Chairs: Helmut K. Anheier, Andrea Römmele of the Hertie School of Governance). The Postdoctoral Fellow will play an active role in the Dahrendorf Forum team based at the Hertie School, as well as being a central element of the inter-institutional partnership with the LSE through close collaboration with the London-based working group one and the there affiliated second Postdoctoral Fellow.

Your tasks:

- Conduct research on better understanding the future of European governance in times of Brexit;
- Produce relevant scholarly articles and practitioner friendly reports, also jointly with other members or the Dahrendorf team, especially the second Postdoctoral Fellow based at LSE and also affiliated with the working group one at LSE;
- Synthesise research outputs and translate into accessible, policy relevant formats;
- Be the responsible coordinator of a foresight process which is part of the Dahrendorf Forum at the Hertie School, in cooperation with a professional foresight analyst;
- Lead a Research Associate;
- Engage effectively with policy makers and practitioners;
- Present research findings at international Dahrendorf outreach events;

- Interact with other members of the Working Group at the two partner institutions and other locations;
- Initiate and sustain links with external bodies to foster collaboration;
- Note: Whilst the role is based at the Hertie School, the Postdoctoral Fellow's affiliation to the LSE-based Working Group means that s/he will be expected to maintain regular contact with colleagues in London, in particular the Dahrendorf postdoctoral fellows based there, and travel there frequently to participate in activities.

- An excellent PhD in social sciences (political science, sociology, or other)
- A strong publication list (both peer-reviewed academic publications and policy-oriented outcomes)
- A strong record of conference presentations and ability to present research to diverse audiences
- Experience in managing the publication process of own research and in self-reliant coordinating of edited volumes
- Ability to form own research that contributes to the project and the broader research of the team in a substantive way

- A sound understanding of European Governance and the implications of Brexit on the institutional and political developments of the European Union, in particular European foreign and security policy and EU's relationship with neighbours and strategic partners
- Knowledge of the EU institutional system and decision-making processes within the Union
- Knowledge of various foresight approaches and experience in their application in social sciences
